What does "knowledge of Him" have to do with growing constantly in the virtues Peter describes? (See 1 Peter 2:9-10 and Ephesians 1:3-12).	1:10 is probably the most troubling passage in this discussion. Certainly we can't argue against the Christian lifestyle that Peter is urging, but is this way of life (these "good works") really how we make our "election sure"? (See 1 John 2:3-6)
